


SGC Connecting Communities

The program aims to accelerate **community-led climate projects** statewide and **demonstrate best practices** in centering communities burdened by pollution and other structural harm while advancing **strategic collaborations with the philanthropy sector** and **other private funding sources** to further enhance investment into underserved communities across the state:

- Supports SGC's current grantees and unawarded applicants with grant writing assistance and other tailored resources for grant applications to the US EPA funding under the Inflation Reduction Act.
- Supports a vast array of community-driven priorities, including extreme heat mitigation, workforce development, and other climate resilience projects.

U.S. EPA Inflation Reduction Act Community Change Grants Program

Funds environmental and climate justice activities to benefit disadvantaged communities through projects that reduce pollution, increase community climate resilience, and build community capacity to address environmental and climate justice challenges.

SGC's Community Assistance for Climate Equity

Tribal Capacity Building Pilot Program

Offers technical assistance and tailored support to help California tribes secure grants for projects that bolster resilience and address the root causes of climate change.

Regional Climate Collaboratives (RCC) Program

Funds coalitions of community-serving partners in under-resourced communities to establish community priorities, develop a pipeline of projects, and align projects with state, federal, and philanthropic funding opportunities.

BOOST Program

Supports capacity building in under-resourced local governments so they can advance their climate, resilience, and equity goals.

Partners Advancing Climate Equity (PACE) Program

Connects frontline community leaders across California to learn together, tackle shared challenges, and build capacity to advance climate equity locally and statewide.

Get Involved and Respond to Public Comment Requests




The Community Air Grants (CAGs) provide funds to California community-based nonprofit 501(c)(3) organizations and California Native American Tribes to support community-driven projects to reduce harmful emissions and exposures to air pollution in communities most impacted by poor air quality in the state.

The CAGs are funded, in part, through the State's portion of Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF).
